The Founders

The life of Sun Myung Moon is a remarkable one in which the hand of God has been clearly visible. It is a shining example of vision, faith and love for all. Reverend Moon is dedicated to establishing a world of *peace*, *unity* and *harmony* under God.

Born in 1920 to a rural family in a northwestern Korean village, Reverend Moon was raised in a Christian environment. At the age of 16, Sun Myung Moon had an encounter with Jesus Christ which led him to embark on

a major spiritual quest.

In 1946 at the end of World War 11, as he began to teach in north Korea, he was arrested and served two and a half years in a concentration camp, until he was liberated in October 1950 by advancing American-led U.N. forces in the Korean War. In those years, many of his fellow prisoners came to him in desperation for guidance and spiritual strength. To the dying he gave the will to live. Later, Reverend Moon would recall that experience: "I never prayed from weakness. I never asked for help. How could I tell God, my Father, about my suffering, and cause His heart to grieve still more. I could only tell Him I would never be defeated by my suffering."

Following his release, Reverend Moon began teaching in south Korea where he was also persecuted and imprisoned because of his beliefs. Since then, his message and work have spread to over 130 countries on six continents.

In 1960, Reverend Moon married Miss Hak Ja Han, who has been an example of dedication and sacrifice helping to raise a world-wide movement. After more than 30 years of marriage, they are the proud parents of 13 children

and many grandchildren.

If there is to be an ideal world, an infrastructure has to be built that will assist in its achievement. For this reason, Reverend Moon has founded scores of organizations that embrace religion, politics, economics, and science, stimulating a spectrum of enterprises in the media, industry, high technology, academia, humanitarian efforts as well as the arts.

Billions of dollars, generated from the many businesses and industries he founded, have been allocated to educate individuals and humanity as a whole, to embrace the original mission of Christ to become peacemakers, unifiers and harmonizers.

Only with such a commitment can true peace be born, grow and prosper, and man's exploitation of his brother be finally eliminated. It is in this spirit that The Summit Council for World Peace was founded.

# Seoul Declaration on Peace




ATRERED TOGETHER in Seoul, Rorea, fully aware of their responsibilities, the undersigned former Fleads of State and Government, former Prime Ministers, and other participants in the Inaugural Meeting of the Summit Council for World Peace enjoin all incumbent leaders everywhere, and all those active with the media and in the generation of public information, to pursue every effort to further and enhance the prospects of peace.

War and violence, in our own time, threaten the very survival of humanity and deny the eminent dignity of man. The only alternative is peace. This peace can be lasting and effective only if it is predicated upon the recognition of the true value of human beings, which comes of the relationship between man and the Creator and through service to one's fellowman.

Furthermore, those gathered here appeal to the nations of the world to support a crusade for a new awakening toward a higher value perspective. Such an effort shall harness the good will of humanity to defeat and eliminate the forces that are preying on humankind — totalitarian ideologies such as communism and the ills of society such as injustice and the scourges of hunger, disease, and ignorance.

The challenges that we face today require solutions that must be the result of individual as well as collective efforts. By definition, these would represent a campaign for higher values that emphasizes spiritual fulfillment, rather than the profit motive, as the driving force for development in the world. Creating an environment conductive to such a task is the responsibility of every human being, but especially of leaders in office. Only in such an environment can peace be born, grow and prosper, and man's exploitation of his brother be finally eliminated.

The accomplishment of all this bemands commitment and dedication. It requires support, both material and spiritual. The participants in the Summit Council for World Peace, therefore, are appreciative of the generous support accorded by the Reverend Sun Myung Moon. We are convinced that from this endeavor will come the answers that constitute the hope of the peaceful future of our world.


