THE SOVEREIGN GREEK ORDER OF SAINT DENNIS OF ZANTE



The pious and venerable Order of Saint Dennis of Zante has its roots within the ancient Military and Hospitaller Order of St. John of Jerusalem which was established in 1096 during the First Crusade.

The order of St. John held sovereign territory within the Holy City and Palestine during the period 1096 - 1291. At the conclusion of this period, the Knights of the Order were expelled from the Holy Land to Cyprus by the followers of Islam. The Order continued to prosper in Cyprus until 1310 when another Muslim invasion resulted in its expulsion to the Island of Rhodes, where it finally found shelter from its enemies. The Knights held Rhodes successfully, building fortresses and establishing themselves as a formidable power in the Mediterranean.

At the beginning of the 16th century, the Ottoman Empire invaded Rhodes. Following a prolonged siege, the Christian Knights were forced to leave the island. It was during this dispersion that decisions were made as to the new destinations for the Order of St. John.

One faction of the Order relocated to Malta; however, another faction followed Michael Vourtzis, Duke of Antioch, to the Island of Zante. In 1524, the Knights received sovereign territory, in perpetuity, in a grant made by the Doge of Venice. This document gave full recognition and independence to the Order to include the power to select succeeding Grand Masters.

In 1547, a child was born to the great noble family of Count Segouros. This child, Dionysios (Dennis), was totally dedicated to service to Our Lord. His life as a devoted monk and, later, Bishop and Archbishop, served as an exemplary example of Christian kindness and humility to all who came to know him. Saint Dennis died in 1624. Seventy-seven years later, in 1703, he was canonized by the Ecumenical Patriarch, Gabriel. Following the canonization of Saint Dennis, the Knights of the Order of St. John on the Island of Zante, moved to change the name of their Order to The Sovereign Greek Order of Saint Dennis of Zante.

During the long history of the Order, the world has changed many times over. The political boundaries of countries have altered and many individuals have sought homes in the New World.

Throughout the world, the Knights of St. Dennis have become well known in the many different countries in which they reside. In America, Knights of the Order of St. Dennis fought for the Continental Army, a fact well documented in the Archives of the United States' Congress. Two Greek Knights from renowned noble families of Zante, Count Logothetis and Count Vourtzis, served as aides de camp to General Lafayette. It was within these two families that the Grand Mastership of the Order of St. Dennis continued into modern times.

Today, the Knights of the Order of St. Dennis of Zante stand ready to serve those in need. They are actively involved in promoting world peace and have created educational scholarships for children with scientific interests and abilities, raised medical supplies in support of disaster relief operations and have remained devoted to the Holy Church from which they draw their strength and vision of Knightly Service. The Order's goal remains lofty: to lead the nations of the world into a better future.

Presently, the Grand Master of the Order is His Serene Highness the Most Eminent, Prince Sbigneus Casimir Dworak Biziel Dworowiecki.
